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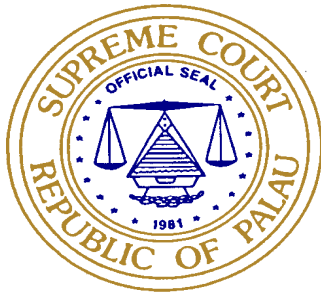
The Palau Judiciary is pleased to welcome the first Court Counsel for 2018 – 2019, Ms. Danielle Tucker.
