Kenneth Uyehara was born in Medalaii, Koror, to Marianne Teiko Uyehara from Angaur and Harry K. Uyehara, from Hawaii. Ken and his family left Palau in the 1960s due to his father's job.

Ken graduated from Hawaii Prep Academy and went on to Coe College in Cedar Rapids Iowa, graduating with a BA in Business Administration, Biology, and General Science. He earned his MBA from the University of

Guam. Ken returned to Palau in 2004 after retiring from the United States Air Force/Air National Guard, not only to enjoy the lifestyle of island life, but to serve according to God's will. Since Ken returned to Palau, he has owned and operated his own real estate appraisal company. Being a sole proprietor of the company has allowed Ken to answer calls to serve Palau in different capacities. Included in his service is membership in Palau Chamber of Commerce, serving as President for 8 terms; board member of the FIC; PPUC General Manager; Angaur State Governor.

Lorish in the Court of Appeals of Virginia. She is a member of the Washington D.C. bar. Alex is looking forward to living in Palau, and hopes to learn a lot about Palauan culture.
