



## Application for Admission to the Palau Bar *Instructions*

All applicants seeking admission to the Palau Bar must complete **Form A: Character & Fitness Questionnaire**. Form A includes an affidavit and a general release form, both of which must be signed and notarized. Additionally, all applicants must submit:

- ❑ A original certificate of good standing, issued within 30 days of their application, from the bar of *each* jurisdiction in which the applicant is a member, *OR*, if the applicant is not and has never been a member of any bar, a letter from the applicant's law school attesting to the applicant's good moral character
- ❑ Certification of graduation by the law school's registrar or a photocopied diploma

### **Admission without Examination: (Government Attorneys)**

Applicants for admission without examination, pursuant to Rule 3 of the *Rules of Admission*, must complete **Form B: Admission without Examination**.

### **Admission by Examination (Palau Bar Exam)**

Applicants seeking admission by examination must complete **Form C: Admission by Examination**. A check for \$300.00 made payable to Clerk of Courts, Supreme Court of Palau.

Applications to sit for the Palau Bar Exam must be received at least forty-five days before the date of the next examination. It may take a week or more to process your application.
